Point-in-Time Homelessness Count Brandon 2018 Summary Results

On April 12, 2018, trained volunteers conducted surveys with people experiencing homelessness in Brandon to learn more about who they are in order to better take action to solve this problem.

THE NUMBERS:

121 homeless individuals identified

84 surveys conducted

THE DEMOGRAPHICS:

62 respondents identified as Indigenous

66 respondents had experienced addiction

48 men interviewed

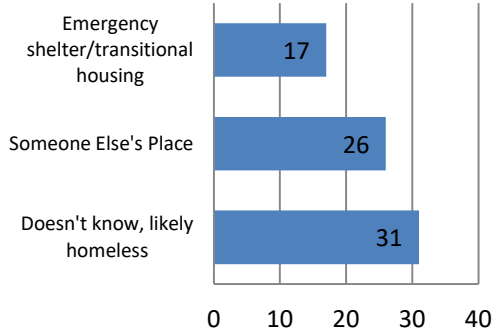
31 women interviewed

2 two-spirit individuals interviewed

37 average age of respondents

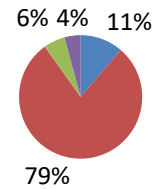
25 average age respondents first became homeless

Where Respondents Were Staying the Night of April 12, 2018



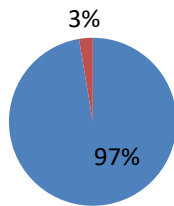
Where Respondents Were From

- Alberta

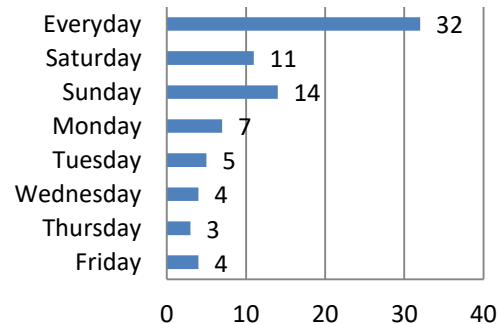


Percentage of Respondents That Want Permanent Housing

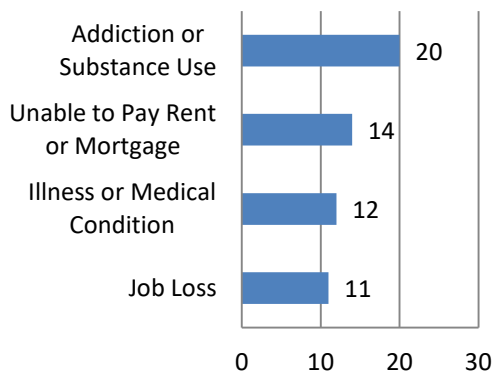
- Want Permanent Housing
- Don't Want Permanent Housing



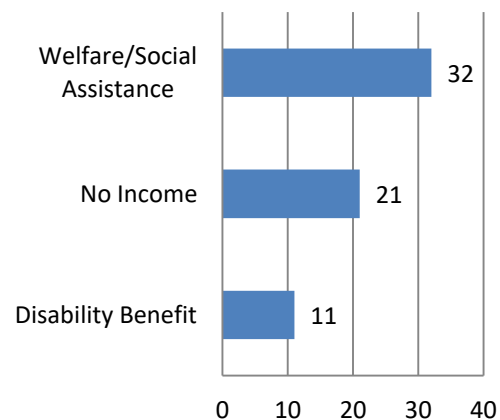
Days Of the Week Respondents Struggle to Find Housing
